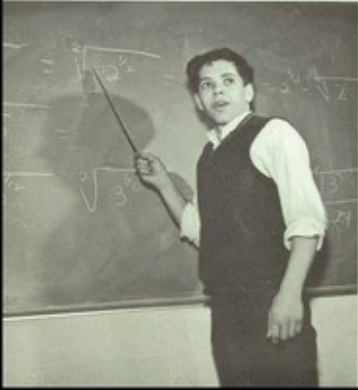
EUGENE L. MILLER

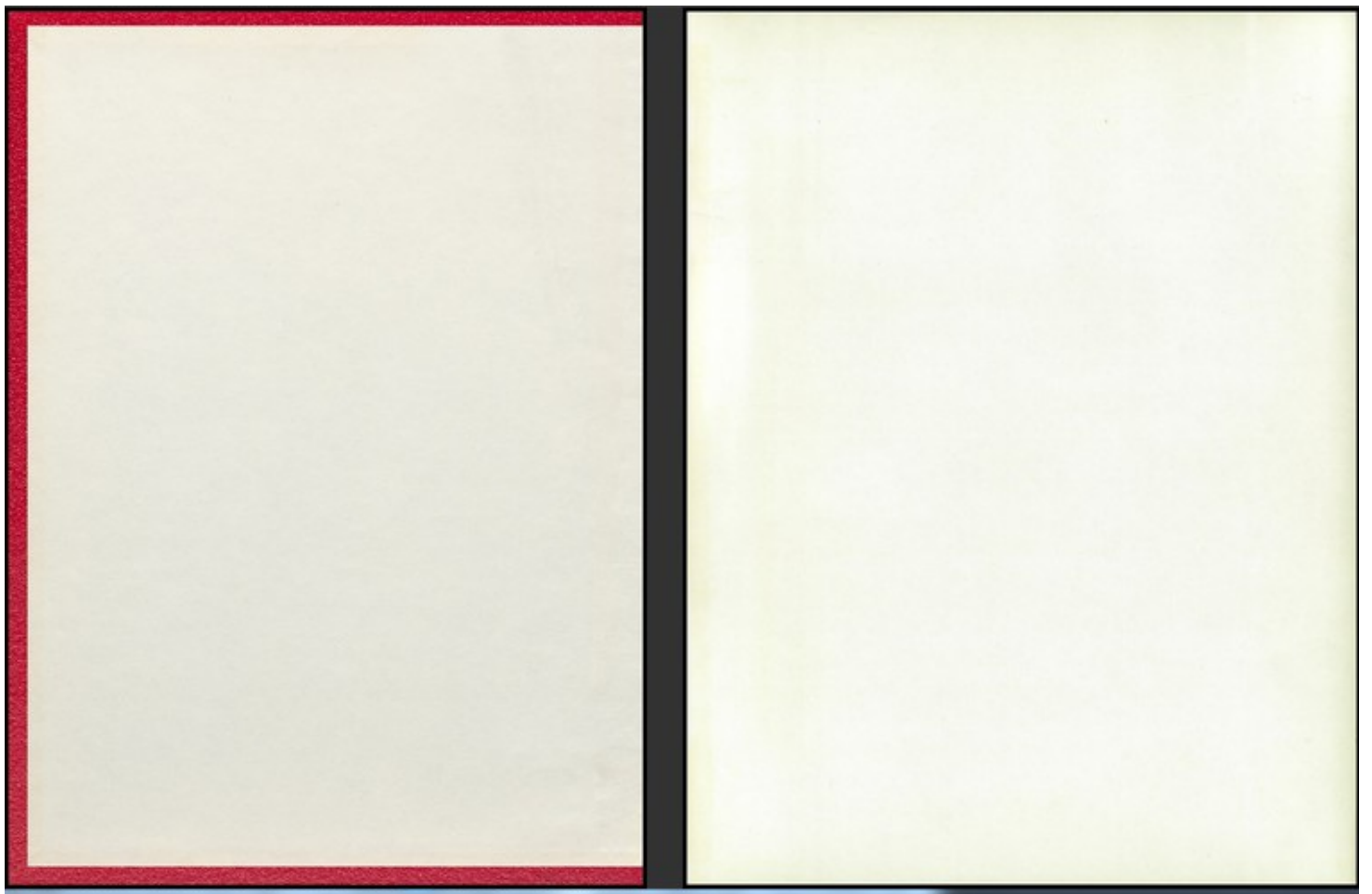

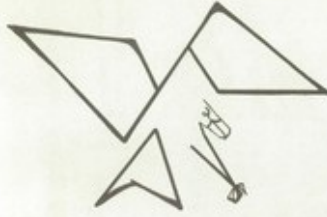

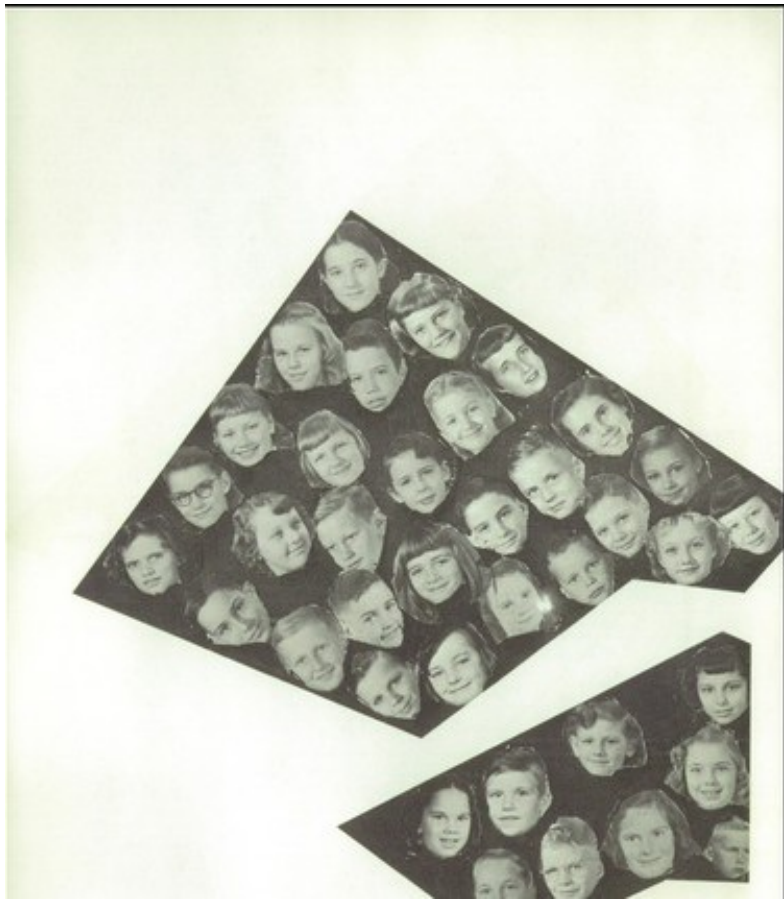
MARGARET ANN WARD

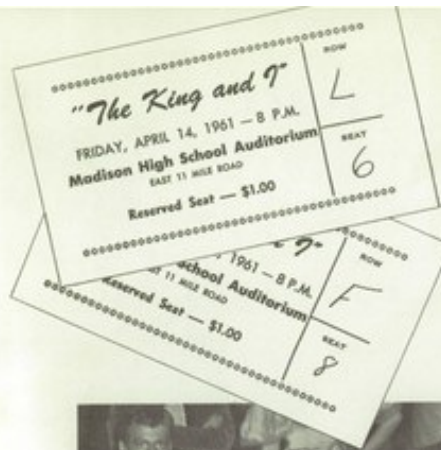
